This international smash-hit may be the most popular musical in the world, and it caps Theatre Jacksonville's 94th season in an exclusive first for local theatres on the First Coast. It's 19th Century France. The nation is in the midst of revolution, and convict Jean Valjean is running from the law. Hunted relentlessly by the policeman Javert for breaking his parole, he must create a new life and honor his promise to raise the young orphaned Cosette. This epic story follows the increasingly dangerous cat and mouse chase between the two men as Valjean seeks to protect the ones he loves. Grand and uplifting, Les Miserables packs an emotional wallop that has thrilled audiences all over the world.



Love Goes to Press

Written in the aftermath of World War II, Love Goes to Press opened in London in 1946 and on Broadway in 1947. Written as a relief for the survivors of Blitzkrieg and ration cards, today it is a devilishly entertaining portrayal of the Battle of the Sexes. In this wise-cracking romantic comedy, set in a press camp on the Italian front in 1944, two women war correspondents - smart, sexy, and famous for scooping their male competitors - struggle to balance their professional lives with their love lives. The two glamorous American journalists are autobiographical creations of the authors: Martha Gellhorn and Virginia Cowles who met while covering the Spanish Civil War.

Time Stands Still

Sarah is a photo journalist who has returned from covering the Iraq war after being injured by a roadside bomb. Her reporter boyfriend James is swamped by guilt after leaving her alone in Iraq. Theirs is a partnership based on telling the toughest stories, and together, making a difference. But when their own story takes a sudden turn, the adventurous couple confronts the prospect of a more conventional life. This compelling play about changing relationships and developing social issues is by one of America's most important contemporary playwrights, Donald Margulies, who received the 2000 Pulitzer Prize for Drama for *Dinner With Friends*.

The Miracle Worker

Immortalized onstage and screen by Anne Bancroft and Patty Duke, this classic tells the story of Annie Sullivan and her student, blind and mute Helen Keller. The Miracle Worker dramatizes the volatile relationship between the lonely teacher and her charge. Trapped in a secret, silent world, unable to communicate, Helen is violent, spoiled, almost sub-human and treated by her family as such. Only Annie realizes that there is a mind and spirit waiting to be rescued from the dark, tortured silence. With scenes of intense physical and emotional dynamism, Annie's success with Helen finally comes with the utterance of a single, glorious word: "water".
