# THE CHAMPAGNE CHARLIE STAKES

Theatre Jacksonville ups the ante this spring by bringing the comedy *The Champagne Charlie Stakes* to the stage for an April 29-May 14, 2011 run. Just in time for Kentucky Derby season, *The Champagne Charlie Stakes* is a heartwarming comedy about love, integrity and growing old gracefully.

It's a very special day at the racetrack, where "Champagne" Charlie, a race-track regular, has had a race named in his honor. A dreamer and teller of tall tales, Charlie is accompanied by his wife of 53 years, Mary Lee, an incurable romantic, who still finds Charlie very attractive. They are accompanied by Jackie, a family friend and race track bookie, and their daughter, Mary, a high-school drama teacher, and the realist in the family who has nervously invited along her long-time boyfriend, Paul, to finally meet her parents. Since this is such a special day, Charlie conspires with Jackie to place the bet of his life – his entire meager savings ("the whole shebang") – on a long-shot hunch.

"We're thrilled to produce this very sweet play," said **Sarah Boone**, Executive Director of Theatre Jacksonville. "It's such a funny, lovely piece of work from playwright Bruce Graham who also wrote *Moon Over the Brewery* which was such a big hit for us in 2007"





**PHILLIP GROW** Behind the scenes of every show at Theatre Jacksonville, there's a small army of volunteers who make it all happen – and that includes crafting the props and scenery. That's where **Phillip Grow** shines in our Volunteer Spotlight.

Phillip is a retired carpenter and cabinetmaker. He got his professional cabinetmaking license in 1987 in France, and has been an active woodworker ever since, starting as a journeyman on construction sites. After moving to the US, Philip set up a woodworking business selling novelty items such as wooden toys and puzzles on the internet and also volunteered for Habitat for Humanity, first in the Bay Area where he earned the Regular Volunteer ("Yellow Hat") status doing framing, roofing and dry walling, and then in the Jacksonville area.

Since 2007, Phillip has been a volunteer with Theatre Jacksonville, working on set design and construction as well as furniture and props. His specialty set creations include the doll house and rustic wheelbarrow in *The Secret Garden*; the set turntables for *Into the Woods* and the courtroom tables that took such a beating in *Inherit the Wind*.
