

What began as a noticeable gap in Jacksonville's arts offering for our community's youngest audience, Theatre for Babies has bloomed into a full program that is growing on the First Coast. Funded by the Chartrand Family Trust, Theatre Jacksonville brought the Train the Trainer Workshop with Maja Ardal (award-winning Canadian actor, director, playwright, theatre trainer and producer to town to work with local actors to help them build the skills needed to carry them through from concept to show. The pilot project is now wrapping up and Theatre Jacksonville's unique show, Everything's a Circle, is currently available to the public.

With two venues up and running at DuBow Preschool and Christ Episcopal Church—and more coming soon—we recognize that reaching out to parents of infants is very targeted. We just went to the experts to learn how to do it, so it's fun for the babies as well as the parents and caregivers."

It featured Astronaut Sarah (Boone) and Astronaut Ron (Shreve) as stories were combined with classical music featuring a flying theme, aimed at third graders from area schools in Duval County.

These trips to the stars connect students to offerings in **S**cience. **T**echnology, **E**ngineering, **A**rts, and **M**athematics. The program is currently funded through federal dollars and provides cultural experiences to students, most of whom would not otherwise receive these kinds of opportunities.
